Origin of International Women's Day!

International Women's Day is a global day celebrated yearly on March 8 to draw attention towards issues such as gender equality, reproductive rights, and violence and abuse against women.

International Women's Day emerged from labour movements in North America and Europe during the early twentieth century, fuelled by the universal female suffrage movement.

The first version was allegedly a "Women's Day" organised by the Socialist Party of America on February 28, 1909 in New York City. This prompted German delegates at the 1910 International Socialist Women's Conference to propose that "a special Women's Day" be organised annually, albeit without a specific date;[8] the following year saw the first demonstrations and commemorations of International Women's Day across Europe. After women gained suffrage in Soviet Russia in 1917 (the beginning of the February Revolution), International Women's Day was declared a national holiday on March 8; it was later observed by the socialist movement and communist countries

on that date. Until the late 1960s, the holiday was associated with far-left movements and governments. It was then adopted by the global feminist movement. Following the adoption of International Women's Day by the United Nations in 1977, it became a mainstream global holiday.

International Women's Day is observed in a variety of ways around the world; it is a public holiday in some countries and is observed socially or locally in others to celebrate and promote women's achievements.

The UN observes the holiday in connection with a specific issue, campaign, or theme in women's rights. In some parts of the world, International Women's Day is still marked by protests and calls for radical change; in others, particularly in the West, it is largely sociocultural and centred on a celebration of womanhood.


My Mother!



The Iron Lady (2011)


Meryl Streep is one of the most incredible and legendary actors in Hollywood. She stuns the audience with every character she plays on screen.
